Yom Kippur Book of Memory Rabbi's Message 5786


In the Jewish year, four times we gather for *Yizkor*, our memorial service: on **Yom Kippur, Shemini Atzeret**, the final day of **Pesach**, and the second day of **Shavuot**. Each of these moments comes at the culmination of a sacred season: Yom Kippur, the day when we seek forgiveness and draw closest to God; Shemini Atzeret, the festival that lingers at the end of Sukkot, when tradition teaches that God asks us to "tarry one more day" before departing; the last day of Pesach, when the memory of redemption and crossing into freedom is at its peak; and Shavuot, the anniversary of receiving Torah at Sinai.

These occasions come at turning points in the Jewish calendar, moments when we naturally reflect on our relationship to God, to our people's story, and to those who came before us. The message is clear: remembrance is not separate from holiness, but part of it. Our encounters with God and community are enriched when we carry with us the legacies of those who shaped us.

To remember is not only to look back—it is also to bring our loved ones forward with us. Our sages taught that "the righteous are called alive even in their death" (Berakhot 18a), because their words, their deeds, and their love continue through those who carry them. When we encounter a familiar song, a scent, a holiday table, or even a simple phrase, memory can be so vivid that we feel their nearness. They are not gone from us; they remain within us, part of our story, part of our lives.

These past two years, our prayers of remembrance also reach beyond our personal circles. We hold in sacred memory the hostages taken into captivity, many of whom were never granted the chance to return home, to embrace their families once more. Their absence is borne not only by their families, but within the memory of the entire Jewish people. We carry them, too, in our prayers and in our grief.

In this season of holiness, may memory be a blessing, may love outlast loss, and may the presence of those who came before us continue to guide us on our journey.

What is the Book of Memory?

The pamphlet you hold in your hand, the Beth Hillel Temple *Book of Memory*, is the latest link in a venerable, old Jewish tradition that has helped our people recall and honor the dead for centuries.

Since medieval times, "Memorbuchen" were kept in Jewish archives throughout Europe and were often the only historical records of a particular community. Memorbuchen contained names of rabbis, communal leaders, records of persecutions, and lists of martyrs to be read at synagogue memorial (Yizkor) services. They often contained prayers in Hebrew and in the vernacular as well.

Our Beth Hillel Book of Memory serves these same purposes. It is an archival record of our community and an enhancement of our Yizkor worship experience. Along with the names In Loving Remembrance of those who have died in the past year are found the names of deceased rabbis and members who died while serving in the Armed Forces of the United States. Those are followed by the names of those inscribed on our Memorial Tablets, and the names of the departed that our members have submitted.

On Yom Kippur, the *Book of Memory* helps us to contemplate the memory of those who have guided us as individuals and as a community to this day. This booklet can guide us after Yom Kippur as well. At home, use it any time – to draw inspiration and courage from the past and to contemplate the meaning of life and death.
